Official minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting, St Paul Lutheran Church <u>30 January 2022</u>

The meeting was called to order by President Kevin Heck at 10:30 a.m. There were 61 members present; 50 being a quorum, business could be conducted.

Pr. Bob Lewis lead the devotions from the Annual Report cover.

The agenda was presented. A motion was made to accept the agenda: M Doug Wessling S Shanade Stevenson P

The minutes of the 2021 Annual Meeting (January 31,2021) were presented. A motion was made to accept the minutes: M Gary Jensen S Audrey Dittmer P

Connie Ludvigson presented the Nominating Committee's report which consisted of the nominees for election to Congregation Council, Task Forces and Committees. She noted that several positions remained open with no nominees. President Heck opened nominations from the floor. Hearing none, a motion was made to accept the full slate as presented by the Nominating Committee: M Janet Volkert

Pastor Bob Lewis gave a short review of ministry over the past twelve months.

Sue Fitch presented the Financial Secretary's report for Karen Scott. Discussion ensued about how St Paul's benevolence giving is not part or percentage of a unified church budget, but rather, "what comes in goes out." There are spending goals for benevolence each year but since benevolence giving is not part of a unified church budget, these are only goals. President Heck noted that in this year's Congregational Budget the goals for benevolence giving should be publicized from time to time to the whole congregation. President Heck noted that we used to have benevolence recipient organizations like LSI and the Western Iowa Synod come to St Paul and make presentations during worship, so to raise awareness. He hoped this could happen again.

President Kevin Heck presented the Foundation report. A motion was made to accept the Foundation report: M Doug Wessling S Sue Fitch P President Kevin Heck presented the 2022 St Paul Lutheran Church proposed budget. President Heck noted that the staff will be receiving an across the board 2% pay increase for 2022, except for Pr Lewis, who will take his as an additional (5th) week of vacation annually going forward. A motion was made to accept and enact the 2022 St Paul Lutheran church budget as proposed in the Annual Report:

Terri Schimmer made a motion to give the Congregation Council authority to spend up to \$10,000 of general funds to pay down the mortgage on the Kiel St Parsonage during 2022. Craig Peterson proposed amending the motion to increase that amount by \$36,000 and to take those funds from the first Certificate of Deposit at Availa Bank (which matures in 2022). Discussion ensued. It was noted that this first Certificate of Deposit includes funds obtained from selling the Lubeck Street Parsonage to Pastor and Marilyn Benson.

A motion was made to authorize the Congregation Council to redeem the first Certificate of Deposit at Availa Bank when it matures in 2022, and use those funds (approximately \$36,000) to pay down the principal on the mortgage on the Kiel Street Parsonage. Additionally the Congregation Council is authorized during 2022 to make additional payments on the principal on the mortgage on the Kiel Street Parsonage as they deem appropriate from the General Fund, in a total amount not to exceed \$10,000.

(It was noted that the sum of these two authorizations together will pay off the mortgage on the Kiel Street Parsonage.)

Jim Kistenmacher presented a proposal to use monies received by St Paul over 2020 and 2021 from the State of Iowa and other sources as stipends and grants for Wee Wisdom Preschool during these years of COVID-19 (a total of \$31,750.00) to update the bathroom by the Wee Wisdom room and also enclose the adjacent hallway, making a pantry for the kitchen and a secured entrance for Wee Wisdom. Jim explained that the kitchen contractor believes that doing the work now, while the kitchen is being remodeled, is a good idea. A motion was made to authorize the expenditure of up to \$31,750.00 from the General Fund to make these changes and improvements, in conjunction with the kitchen remodeling project:

Church Properties Task Force Report

The church properties committee had a busy year not only at the church, but at both parsonages. Pastor's house on Kiel Street had some issues with his tub and toilet that A-1 fixed. The water heater and stove also had to be replaced. The a/c unit is old and will need to be replaced soon.

The Altona parsonage has some light and outlet issues that we are going to have Holstein Electric look at. Shower valves are on the list with A-1 to be getting replaced. When the plumbers come to fix the shower, we would like them to also check the softness of the water. When we had Window World look at church windows, they also looked at a couple of windows at this house to fix so they have that list also.

We have replaced many lights bulbs in the narthex of the church. The youth forum room got a makeover this year, and the committee helped by replacing the drop in ceiling tile with new. When the kitchen remodel started, the demolition process found a wall that had moisture behind it. Upon further investigation we found that the north parking lot south part that connected to the building needed to be re-caulked along the building and down the steps. We also spent a day cleaning the church yard of debris and tree limbs, along with sweeping both parking lots to get ready for outdoor worship in the spring. The Northwest wall in Pastor's office needed resealed and painted from a moisture leak years ago. Also had a light and light switch to get replaced in his office. The ceiling of the bell tower room needed to get reenforced from when the bell tower had a leak. We had to build a new ceiling in there to keep the blocks from falling down. That process had new drywall and is mud and taped, just needs to be painted yet. In doing this repair we found bad electrical wires that ran through the conduit that had water damage to it and melted down. Worst case scenario if we would not have found this, the church could have caught fire and burned down. One A/C unit in the Narthex had to be replaced this year, as well as the small window a/c in the Church office. We installed covers on this a/c unit and the window a/c unit in Jim's office that will need to be removed in the springtime.

Window World came and gave us quotes for new windows and trim for the basement windows for the preschool room and the main floor for all the offices. Also, they gave us a quote for replacing the big window on the landing between the second and third floor. We also had many small projects that had to be completed in order for us to complete the bigger projects, like the kitchen remodel and preschool bathroom remodel.

Projects to be considered in the future are church windows that we had a quote for, carpet in the sanctuary, and carpet in the fellowship hall/youth forum.

Jobs to be done yearly:

Set up a day in the spring to clean properties and parking lots for outdoor worship (have had Scott Niemier with the city bring down street sweeper).

Cover and remove window A/c units in the fall and springtime.

We hire lawn care and snow removal for the church. Steve Koth has been taking care of the lawn duties at the Kiel parsonage.

I recommend taking notes for all your meetings because at the end of the year you will be writing an annual report to be completed in January.

Council President's Report

At the beginning of the year, as most people do, the St. Paul congregation made goals and resolutions. We agreed to focus more on our benevolence, eliminate debt, and do some renovating to our building. I'm pleased to note that we saw these goals through.

After a long search we hired a new administrative assistant, Natasha, in February and paid off the Kiel parsonage in March. Benevolence throughout the year was distributed to various organizations and causes. This year over \$20,500 was given to benevolence.

A number of building projects were completed. Indeed, much of our effort and energy went into these projects. The kitchen remodel began in February, while the preschool bathroom remodel began in August. The South doors were replaced and the forum room refreshed. The bell tower was also finally secured and one of the large A/C units replaced. Some projects were planned, while others were completed out of necessity. Patience and resourcefulness were tested as things took longer than we wanted or plans needed to be changed entirely. Yet, at the end of the year everything managed to wrap up. The South doors and kitchen each had a special dedication.

All of this on top of our regular operations. Even the mid-week bulletin received a refresh. Coffee hour continued to be held despite the remodeling in the kitchen. Vacation Bible school, God's Work, Our Hands, and NovemberFest were all held successfully.

At the heart of all this were the St. Paul members, who in various ways and with their many talents helped see these achievements to fruition. Our congregation stayed strong and focused on our goals this year. While more work is in the future, the new congregation council will have some great plans, we'll meet that too. And by the grace of God, we'll do it together.

Decorating Committee Annual Report 2022

The Decorating Committee has made many significant changes through the year. We were able to complete the High School Forum Room project with a remarkable transformation in an attempt to grow and strengthen the program for a large number of our youth. The changes were made possible by a very generous \$15,000 gift left to our church for this very purpose. The room was painted in an exciting color and new lighting was installed. Then all new furniture was purchased which will provide the necessary seating for the larger numbers of LOGOS students of high school age, along with end tables, a large entertainment wall unit, new art for the walls, a new pub table and chairs, and a corner kitchenette that will now allow the serving of snacks to keep this room a fun hang-out for their Christian education. Be sure to check out this wonderful "new room".

At the same time, we were planning and decorating the bathroom used by the preschool students. That bathroom was probably original to the building and sorely in need of change. The room was gutted and slightly enlarged with the removal of doors and then put back together with shiplap walls, new floors, new stalls, new vanity, mirrors, light fixtures, and decorations, all in fun colors for our youngest learners. Also to increase security and safety for the students, access to this bathroom is only through the preschool room which always has locked doors when students are in class. These changes were made possible with Covid funding granted to the preschool budget.

Please notice the new furniture in the hallway at the bottom of the steps when entering through the Sunday School entrance. The walls in this area were repainted and new flooring was installed to match that which was put in the kitchen. To complete this project, a new credenza and wall décor were purchased to update this area making it more welcoming and elegant.

All of these changes involved many, many hours of shopping either online or in various cities, price comparisons, getting and returning samples, and doing some painting. It was fun for the committee to work together on these big projects. Many thanks go to Terri and Leo Schimmer for giving many extra house of work to finalize jobs. We really appreciate all the extra touches you did.

Church History 2022 ~ Historian Annual Report

January 2022

Annual Report of the 2022 Mutual Ministry Committee

The Mutual Ministry Committee is a very interesting and enjoyable committee on which to serve. The purpose of our committee is to first of all be a support team for our Pastor. Second, to be the eyes and ears of the congregation and community, regarding the good and positive health of St. Paul. Six members from our congregation are appointed to the Mutual Ministry Committee and we have met five times throughout the year.

One committee goal was to improve a pastoral evaluation survey that was developed by our team in previous years. This tool and system of evaluation has been successful in the number of surveys that were returned providing feedback, suggestions, questions, and some requests to be considered. We hope to have even more surveys completed and returned next year for even better feedback.

Pastor Bob says he enjoys the sharing of his duties and is most passionate about his job. This is obvious to our committee as we watch the numbers and see how the attendance is increasing. The Easter services had 287 people in attendance with 372 people watching the service on-line, for a total of 659 hearing the Easter message and the music. We have 536 members in our congregation. These are impressive numbers! Pastor Bob continues to offer a buffet of opportunities for people in our congregation, for people in the community, and for many in far places to hear the Word of God. He continues with on-line devotional lessons weekly and will offer a new 8-week study beginning in January. He faithfully delivers God's word to the shut-ins and to those who are sick. He works closely with our music team, comprised of Jim and Kris Kistenmacher and Sharen Borchers, to develop services which are beautiful productions with very meaningful messages. Pastor Bob continues his own education by purposely connecting with his colleagues as well as enrolling in on-line continuing education courses.

One statement was repeated over and over on the evaluation surveys, and our members agree that we are <u>very fortunate</u> to have Pastor Bob leading our congregation in doing what God has called us to do, and that is to *gather, commune*, and to *sing*! Things are going smoothly at St. Paul and our committee will continue our prayers of support for Pastor Bob.

Annual Report for the year 2022 Pastor Bob Lewis

This is the fifth annual report I have written to you, people of St. Paul Lutheran Church. So what shall this one be about?

2018's report was about being new and learning about St. Paul and Holstein.

- 2019 was a year of settling into seasons, routines, and rhythms of the congregation.
- 2020 brought the Year of the Pandemic.
- 2021 was the Year of Coming Back from the Pandemic.

So what of 2022? By my observation, things were remarkably *normal* for the first time in five years. Though the virus was still with us (and will be), it did not have an impact on our activities here at St. Paul. We had Epiphany, Ash Wednesday, Lent, Holy Week and Easter, Pentecost, God's Work our Hands, Confirmation and Advent at full strength and speed once again.

Attendance in worship came back in 2022, and now we have a new way we keep track of participation in worship – through on line viewership. 2022 became the year that as many people participated in worship via our on line worship services, as did in person in the Sanctuary. Over the past two years the Endowment Committee has moved two separate \$50,000 amounts to be invested in an Annuity with American Equity. The first \$50,000 was moved in February of 2021 and has a current balance of \$51,325 with \$1,360.11 accrued interest payable 2/10/2023; the second \$50,000 was moved in April of 2022 with \$1,000 accrued interest payable 4/10/2023. Interest is not collectible within the first year of beginning the annuity, therefore the 2021 annuity principal and interest is currently available, however the 2022 amount is not available until it's first anniversary (4/10/2023).

The \$195,000 Availa CD matured December 17, 2021 and the balance was renewed for another 12 months at 4.10%. The CD earned a total of \$1,365 interest for the year 2022.
