The Lenten journey begins...

The 40-day season of Lent is a journey to Jesus' death and resurrection. In our hymnal's Invitation to Lent liturgy, it states: "We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation." We are called to journey in a way that "contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from God and neighbor." As we prepare our hearts for the death and resurrection of Jesus, we also remember our own baptisms and gift of new life.

The Lenten worship schedule begins on February 18 with our Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 PM which includes the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. We will continue with 7:00 PM Lenten evening prayer services, about half an hour long, for the next five Wednesdays to follow. The congregation is invited to supper in the fellowship hall at 6:15 prior to those Wednesday midweek Lenten worship services.

The LOGOS schedule is altered slightly to accommodate these congregational meals and to allow for the 7:00 p.m. start time for worship. Please take note of the weekly calendar schedule and join us for the family time meal and weekly worship!
